No matter your personal view of the seriousness of this pandemic and the chances that you might catch Covid-19, we all need to work together to lessen the risk to others and enjoy a safe and healthy Wi-Ne-Ma Family Camp



Pre-Camp Screening

Confirmations

- No one is experiencing cold or flu symptoms and had a fever in the past ten days.
- No one has been exposed to someone who has tested positive for Covid-19 in the last 14 Days.

Mitigation/Prevention Guidelines

- Stay home if you are symptomatic and/or at risk for severe complications (over age 65 or have underlying medical conditions)
- Follow Physical Distancing Guidelines.
- Use a face mask or shield when in indoor public settings or setting where it is difficult to maintain 6' of separation. Required for ages 5 and older.

Health Guidelines

- Practice Good Handwashing Hygiene with frequent handwashing for at least 20 seconds and use of hand sanitizer.
- Use good respiratory hygiene. Cover coughs/sneezes with elbow or tissue. If tissue, discard in garbage and wash your hands.
- Avoid touching eyes, nose, mouth with unwashed hands.

Logistics

- Bring your own hygiene supplies: Water Bottles, Face Masks, Hand Sanitizer, Disinfectant Wipes/Spray Disinfectant and cloths.
- Each family must be housed in their own unit (RV, Tent, Camp Housing).
- As much as possible – use the restroom and shower facility in your housing unit.

Session and Other Expectations

- Sessions will be limited to the size of the venue.
- People in different family households are not to congregate in any area whether indoor or outdoor where 6' of separation cannot be maintained.
- If someone in your family comes down with a fever or other flu/cold like symptoms: self-isolate in RV or lodging and contact Camp Office.
