Grades 1–6: Beginning Monday morning, these children meet in Beulah Chapel from 9:00 am to 12:00 pm and from 7:00 pm to 8:45 pm. A sheet of instructions for parents regarding the children's activities is available at the camp office.

PRESCHOOL: Special sessions for children ages 2–3 and ages 4–5 have been designed for their level in Patience Hall. Sessions begin Sunday night.

NURSERY (ages 0–1): Care is provided in Patience Hall for all adult sessions except Bonfire and optional afternoon

activities. **Parents of infants and toddlers are expected to volunteer to help for one session during the week.** We want to adequately staff each session, so please sign-up early. Thank you!

Global Workers

You have a care team here this week for you: Rodney & Laura Peterson, Nancy Spears, Cory Lemke, Steve & Becky Overlin. The care team is available to meet with you for prayer, coaching, debriefing, or just for fun. You may call Becky Overlin to schedule a time with one or more of the care team members (253) 444-7210.

Also, you and your parents are invited to the global workers' reception from 2-4 pm, Monday, July 31st in the Missions building on the mezzanine level. You will get to eat snacks and network with other global workers. The care team will have a short program for you too.

There are special get-togethers for the children of global workers, otherwise known as "third-culture kids" (TCK) because they have a way of life that is unlike their parents' home culture or the host culture in which they have spent most of their childhood. All three TCK events take place from 1:00-2:30 pm at the Missions building on the mezzanine level. Ages 5-12 meet on Tuesday. Ages 13-18 meet on Wednesday. Adult TCKs meet on Thursday.
